REPORT OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS ON THE 2015 SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION BILL

1.0 Introduction

It is my honour and privilege to present to you, the report of the Senate Committee on Appropriations on the 2015 Supplementary Appropriation Bill (SB162).

You may recall that the 2015 Supplementary Appropriation Bill in the sum of N465,636,926,857 (Four Hundred and Sixty-Five Billion, Six Hundred and Thirty Six Million, Nine Hundred and Twenty Six Thousand, Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven Naira) only, was read the first time on the 18th November, 2015, when the President of the Senate read the communication from the President, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, His Excellency, Muhammadu Buhari, forwarding the Bill.

The Senate, on the 24th of November, 2015, debated on the general principles of the Bill and referred same to the Appropriations Committee for further legislative action.

2.0 Objective of the Bill

Fundamentally, the Bill seeks to among other things, make available additional funds for the fight against insurgency in the North-East and payment of outstanding subsidy claims in order to ameliorate the suffering of Nigerians.

3.0 Legislative Action

Considering the fact that the Committee was mandated to report on the Bill within one week, and also the fact that the bulk of the sum in the proposal is contained in the Service Wide Vote, the Committee consulted with the leadership of the relevant Sub-Committees and Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) for their inputs and clarifications, respectively.

4.0 Observation

The Committee observed that:

- 1. The provision for subsidy payment only covers year 2014 arrears of N120.5Billion and the claims of January-September, 2015 of N292.8Billion;
- 2. There is need to provide additional funding in the sum of N108,895,800,000 (One Hundred and Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Naira) only for fuel subsidy for the months of October, November and December 2015 to ensure that the 2016 Budget takes off on a clean slate (this issue came up in the course of clarification of the total subsidy need for the year ending 2015, by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Petroleum Resources);
- 3. The provision for Victim Support Fund in Capital Supplementation should have been made in the Service Wide Vote since it is a Federal Government

contribution to a fund managed by a Committee which is not an MDA of Government;

- 4. There is need to adjust the proposed amendment to the 2015 Fiscal Framework to capture the additional funding need of N108,895,800,000 (One Hundred and Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Naira) only for fuel subsidy;
- 5. As indicated in the amendment to the 2015 Fiscal Framework, the Supplementary Budget will be funded through borrowing;
- 6. With the Supplementary Bill, including the additional funding need of fuel subsidy, the total aggregate expenditure for the fiscal year 2015 will be the sum of N4,493,363,957,158 in the 2015 Appropriation Act, the Proposed sum of N465,636,926,857 and the additional funding need of N108,895,800,000 (One Hundred and Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Naira) only for fuel subsidy amounting to N5.067,896,684,015 trillion.

4.0 Recommendation

The Senate Committee on Appropriations having considered the detailed provisions of the Bill, the contribution of members during the debate on the general principles and the general impact it will make in the security and welfare of Nigerians, especially the need to quickly resolve the perennial end of year problem of fuel scarcity which Nigerians are currently grappling with; do hereby recommend as follows:

The proposed amendment to the 2015 fiscal framework as submitted by the Executive be approved and re-adjusted to accommodate the sum of N108,895,800,000 (One Hundred and Eight Billion, Eight Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Naira) only, for additional November funding for fuel subsidy for the months of October, and December, 2015;

The sum of \$\frac{\text{N}}{25,000,000,000} (Five Billion Naira) only, provided for Victim Support Fund in the Capital Supplementation be re-classified to the Service Wide Vote, and

Approve The Bill for an Act to authorise the issue from the 3. Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation the total sum of N574,532,726,857 (Five Hundred and Seventy-Four Billion, Five and Thirty-Two Million, Seven Hundred and Twenty-Six Thousand, Eight Hundred and Fifty-Seven Naira)only, for additional Recurrent (Non-Debt) Expenditure for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2015 as contained in the attached schedule.

6.0 Conclusion

I wish to thank members of the Committee who have worked almost round the clock including the weekend in order to meet the one-week deadline given by the Senate to report on the bill. I also respectfully thank the Leadership of the Senate and Distinguished Senators for the support and processing the Bill. cooperation accorded the Committee in
